The GeorgiaBEST (Business Ethics Student Training) program is designed to answer some of the top concerns employers have regarding our future workforce - our students. Students earn a GeorgiaBEST certificate through everyday observation and teacher assessment. This certificate serves as validation to employers that students have displayed strong work habits and are ready for the workforce.
